Transcripts and transcripts sending dates	Official Transcripts will be sent within one month of final examinations directly to the exchange coordinator at the student's home institution.
Arrival and Orientation	
Is airport pick-up service available?	Yes, but only on the recommended arrival date. See Exchange Student Calendar above.
Orientation sessions for incoming students	International student orientation will be held on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday, the week before classes start. It is immediately followed by CSU New Student Orientation on Thursday and Friday.
Cultural adjustment programs?	Students are automatically assigned a Cultural Mentor (a current CSU student) who works with them and helps them adjust to life in the United States throughout the semester, http://iss.colostate.edu/cultural_mentor/ . The Cultural Mentor is encouraged to reach out to their mentee prior to the start of the semester. Students have the opportunity to meet each other during Orientation Week.

When and what kind of visa do the students need to obtain? The cost?	<p>J1 – Visiting Student Visa</p> <p>The students will receive a DS 2019 form and instructions for applying for their visa upon acceptance to the exchange program.</p> <p>The cost of the visa (SEVIS fee) is currently \$220 USD. Updated fee Information can be found here: www.fmjfee.com</p> <p>Additionally, there is a \$175 SEVIS University Fee students pay every semester at Colorado State University. The fee is charged during the semester to their CSU student account.</p>
